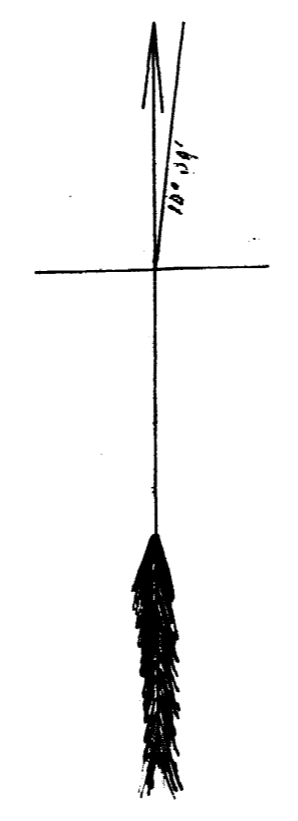


Scale, 66 ft. = 1 inch.

I, W. L. Pitte of the County of Winstead, Territory of Minnesota, do hereby certify, that I have laid out and surveyed the Town of Aurora, in County and Territory aforesaid, and that said Town is situated on the S. E. 1/4 of the S. W. 1/4, & S. E. 1/4 of S. E. 1/4, of Section 18, Township 105 N. of R. 12 W. And that I have placed a stone monument at the N. W. corner of Block No. 5 as a beginning point to said Town, & that said Town consists of 5 whole Blocks & 5 half Blocks, each whole Block containing 4 lots, and each half Block containing 2 lots, and that there is an alley running through the centre of each whole Block 16 1/2 feet wide.

And I further certify, that the streets in said Town are 66 feet wide, and the lots 66 ft. by 132 feet, and that Main Street is laid off East & West, and all the other streets running parallel and at right angles with Main Street, and that all the lots front on the streets running East & West, except lots No. 5 & 6, in Block No. 5, which are laid off fronting on Marion Street, all as shown on the above map or plat.
